TIME: Spring at first harvest of winter barley; day after Passover

LENGTH: 7 Days – beginning and ending with Sabbath

REQUIREMENTS: no work; eat unleavened bread; present a food offering every day; gather for a sacred assembly on 1st and 7th days

PURPOSE: Celebrating the _____ from Egypt

Festival of Harvest (...of Weeks; ...of Pentecost) (23:16a)

(see also: Ex. 34:22; Lev. 23:15-21; Num. 28:26-31; Deut. 16:9-12, 16-17)

TIME: Early Summer - ____ Days after Passover – end of the wheat harvest

LENGTH: One Day (a Sabbath)

REQUIREMENTS: people present "first fruits" of wheat harvest; priests present burnt offerings; gather for a sacred assembly

PURPOSE: Celebrating the giving of the _____

Festival of Ingathering (...of Tabernacles; ...of Booths) (23:16b)

(see also: Ex. 34:22; Lev. 23:33-43; Num. 29:12-38; Deut. 16:13-17)3

TIME: End of Summer and all harvesting – 5 days after Day of Atonement

LENGTH: _____ days

REQUIREMENTS: no work; people camp out in huts made from leafy tree and palm branches; they present and eat food in fellowship with God; the priests offer 199 animal sacrifices through the week
