APPLYING

It's one thing to hear God's Word, it's another to apply it! Answering the questions on your own before your group meets will help you be fully engaged in the discussion.

1. Have you ever been a part of a church or organization that suffered terribly from disunity? What effects did you notice or see in that situation?
2. What would be some “close handed” issues that you would stand firm on?
3. What would be some “open handed” issues that you’ve seen Christians agree to disagree on? How did it work out?
4. We are united as a church in our message. The goal of which is to see God glorified in saving sinners. How can you contribute to seeing the message go out? How can you as a Community Group share the message of hope in the gospel? Take some time and plan or brainstorm about how to do it. The next step is to do it!
5. Spend time praying about Summerside's unity. Growth brings change, and change can make us uncomfortable. Pray that God would not allow disunity to hamper our mission and outreach. Pray that we would be united in mind, thought, and heart together to glorify God.
