HEARING:

The Foolishness of God -#1

1 Corinthians 1:18-25 (pg. 1142)

If you think Christians are a bit nuts, you're not alone...

1 Cor 1:18-19

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written:

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; thee intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate."

Notes:

Foolish because it's scandalous

Foolish because of our pride

Foolish because it's simple

1 Cor 1:20, 21

Where is the wise person Where is the teacher of the law? Where is the philosopher of this age Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since in the wisdom of God the world through its wisdom did not know him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe.

Notes:

1 Cor 1:22-24

Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, 23 but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, 24 but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.

Notes:

Jews demand a sign \Rightarrow Like us saying to God, "Do this and that, and then I'll follow you."

Greeks seek after wisdom \rightarrow Like us saying to God, "You have to think like think, and believe what I believe for me to follow you."

God's response: Look at the answer I've given to you: Jesus Christ crucified!

APPLYING

It's one thing to hear God's Word, it's another to apply it! Answering the questions on your own before your group meets will help you be fully engaged in the discussion.

- Do you ever feel like the message of Jesus is a bit crazy? Have you
 ever met someone who expressed just how crazy they thought
 Christians are?
- 2. Paul says that the message of the cross is foolishness to those who don't know Christ. It's foolish because it kills our pride. Can you explain this? Why do we want to be our own savior?
- 3. What type of signs were the Jews of Jesus' day expecting? From what you know of the Gospels, how did Jesus' words and actions run contrary to expectations?
- 4. Look at the final text (1 Cor 1:22-24). How do we tend to look at God and demand that he act and think like us? How are we prone to doing this?
- 5. Take some time as a group and pray that God would open eyes to see the truth of the message of Jesus. Our people and our missionaries are going out every week and sharing Christ with their friends and neighbors. Pray that God would use their witness to call people to himself.

REMEMBERING

Memorizing is one of the best ways of making truth stick. You can memorize something if you repeat it enough times. Try reading the verse 5 times a day until it sticks! Choose a part of it for your kids if needed.
