1 Corinthians 5:1-13 (pg.

Qu, and of a kind that even pagans do not tolerate: A man is sleeping with his father's wife. And you are proud! Shouldn't you rather have gone into mourning and have put out of your fellowship the man who has been doing this? For my part, even though I am not physically present, I am with you in spirit. As one who is present with you in this way, I have already passed judgment in the name of our Lord Jesus on the one who has been doing this. So when you are assembled and I am with you in spirit, and the power of our Lord Jesus is present, hand this man over to Satan for the destruction of the flesh, so that his spirit may be saved on the day of the Lord.

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Q1 Cor 5:6-8 Your boasting is not good. Don't you know that a little yeast leavens the whole batch of dough? Get rid of the old yeast, so that you may be a new unleavened batch—as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore let us keep the Festival, not with the old bread leavened with malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

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■1 Cor 9-12 I wrote to you in my letter not to associate with sexually immoral people— not at all meaning the people of this world who are immoral, or the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters. In that case you would have to leave this world. But now I am writing to you that you must not associate with anyone who claims to be a brother or sister but is sexually immoral or greedy, an idolater or slanderer, a drunkard or swindler. Do not even eat with such people. What business is it of mine to judge those outside the church? Are you not to judge those inside? God will judge those outside. "Expel the wicked person from among you."

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APPLYING

It's one thing to hear God's Word, it's another to apply it! Answering the questions on your own before your group meets will help you be fully engaged in the discussion.

Community Group Questions

- 1. Have you ever seen or heard of church discipline being done in a restorative, loving way? What about in a destructive, punitive way?
- 2. Why do you think that some Christians tend to want to avoid "sinners"? Look up Matt 9:9-13; How does Jesus interact with sinners?
- 3. In your experience, have Christians you've known tended to be more concerned with the sins of those outside the church, or those inside? Why do you think that is?
- 4. Look up 1 Corinthians 5:9-11. Read it through slowly as a group. In your own words, explain Paul's argument. Why don't we "judge" those outside the church? Why is it such a big deal if someone calls themselves a "Christian" and lives like the devil? Why do you think Paul urges his readers to "not even eat with such a person"?
- 5. What would it look like for you to practice Matthew 18:15-19 in your Community Group or close relationships here in the church? Why is it so important that we take our responsibility seriously to graciously approach people when we see them making terrible, sinful decisions? Have you ever had to do this?

REMEMBERING

Memorizing is one of the best ways of making truth stick. You can memorize something if you repeat it enough times. Try reading the verse 5 times a day until it sticks! Choose a part of it for your kids if needed.
