Community Group Questions

1. Think about the freedom Paul mentions in 1 Corinthians 6:12. Talk about the ways we can lose the freedom he talks about.
2. Which statement below would best describe how you tend to think of your body? How does the way we think about our body affect what we do with it?
 - I have a body
 - I am a body
3. What are some ways that sin affects our body physically? What are some ways sin affects our body spiritually (thinking about being united with Christ)?
4. There are many ways we could condemn the world for their attitude towards issues of sexuality. Instead of talking about those, take some time to think about ways we can present a positive approach to sexuality. In other words, instead of just condemning the world, how can we "show and tell" a better way? Take some time to really think about what this would mean for individuals, a family, your community group, or our church.
5. As you pray, ask God to help us live as temples of the Holy Spirit. Let's pray for wisdom to demonstrate a healthy view of sexuality in our world, and that we would respond in love to people that are living broken lives.

Memorizing is one of the best ways of making truth stick. You can memorize something if you repeat it enough times. Try reading the verse 5 times a day until it sticks! Choose a part of it for your kids if needed.
