# **APPLYING**

It's one thing to hear God's Word, it's another to apply it! Answering the questions on your own before your group meets will help you be fully engaged in the discussion.

## **Community Group Questions**

- 1. Think about some of the infamous kings or leaders from history. Whose reign would you definitely not want to live under? Why? What was their kingdom rule like?
- 2. Read Revelation 1:8 and Hebrews 1:8. What difference does Jesus' eternal kingship make to you? Why is this good news? How does this impact the way that we walk through hardship or difficulties in life?
- 3. In Jesus' day, the people had expectations about the Messiah and what he would do. They were way off! Jesus brought something far better. How can people of today have expectations about God? What is it they expect of him or expect him to be?
- 4. To live under Jesus' reign, we are called to "take up our cross and follow [him]", to "die to self". What does it cost us to live under Jesus' reign? (think: autonomy, independence, the right o sin however we want). But what do we gain? What is the benefit of being a subject of the King?
- 5. How does the Christmas story in Matthew and Luke show us glimpses of what Jesus' humble Kingdom is all about?
