Community Group Questions

- 1. (Leaders can adapt this opening question to fit your group in a respectful way)
 Take time to share a little of your "love" stories. Whether single, married, divorced or widowed, it would be meaningful for your group to share a little of your stories so that you can get to know each other better. Some of our stories could be painful, but it is good to allow others to understand a little of our painful past. Don't worry if this takes up most of your time together.
- 2. What was the main challenge you got from this week's message?
- 3. Love gives, and love respects: Talk about the ways these demonstrations of love show up in a marriage, home, school, or workplace.
- 4. Talk about how marriage and singleness can be thought of as "gifts" from God. How does thinking of something as a gift, affect the way we deal with it?
- 5. As you pray, remember one another, specially in light of hearing one another's stories.
