Community Group Questions

- 1. Talk a little about how you tend to respond to things like the shooting in the church in Texas, or hearing about the millions of Christians around the world who suffer persecution? Is there a "proper" way to respond to these situations?
- 2. Review the three main ways the theme of "son of God" shows up in the Bible. How should this concept affect our everyday lives?
- 3. What is your reaction to the statement that more than being saved from Hell, we need to be saved from God? Explain what that means. How does that give you a different perspective on salvation?
- 4. The Bible often emphasizes the importance of having a right heart, rather than just looking good on the outside. Discuss what that means practically, and think of ways people can take that concept to one extreme or the other.
- 5. We usually think of God rescuing us in terms of the initial step of salvation. In what sense do we need God to keep rescuing us?
