William Wilberforce (1759-1833) led the twenty-year fight to abolish the British slave trade. He championed medical aid for the poor, prison rehabilitation, education for the deaf and restrictions on child labour. Wilberforce found nothing more effectual than private prayer, and the serious perusal of the New Testament. He maintained: "All may be done through prayer, almighty prayer." He insisted that "in the calmness of the morning, before the mind is heated and wearied by the turmoil of the day, you have a season of unusual importance for communing with God and with yourself." He seized upon such opportunities, believing:

"God will prosper me better if I wait on him."

APPLYING

It's one thing to hear God's Word, it's another to apply it! Answering the questions on your own before your group meets will help you be fully engaged in the discussion.

Community Group Questions

- 1. What has God been teaching you through the study of Exodus? What themes, ideas, or patterns are you noticing?
- 2. The salvation that God provides is ultimately from himself (see 12:12-13). Why do we, today, need to be saved by God and FROM God? (Hint: Who do we stand guilty before? Who is our judge? Remember that his judgement "passed over" the family and symbolically landed on the lamb.
- 3. There was one way of salvation for Israel the blood of the Lamb as a substitute, applied to their doorways. There is one way of salvation for you and I today: Jesus. Look at the 6 points about the exclusivity of Jesus. Spend some time looking up the references that are provided. Do you think you could explain why Jesus is the only way of salvation?
- 4. Spend time as a group praying that we, as a church, would be faithful and clear as we share with our friends and neighbors how Jesus is the only way of salvation. Pray that God would give us a passion and burning desire to share the incredible salvation that Jesus offers.

REMEMBERING

Memorizing is one of the best ways of making truth stick. You can memorize something if you repeat it enough times. Try reading the verse 5 times a day until it sticks! Choose a part of it for your kids if needed.
