For Our Congregation

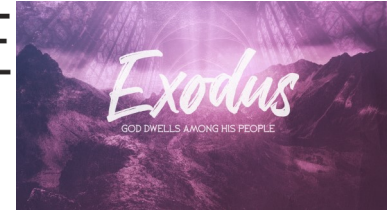
- **Doug Gibb** has been diagnosed with a cancer that has spread to several organs and cannot be successfully treated;
